WELCOME TO FAITH!

From Pastor Tom's Desk...

A number of years ago, the church I was serving purchased a new copy machine. As the technician was installing the copier in our office, he rather casually said, "Of course, you realize that this machine requires a dedicated line." My first thought was, "You mean a line that really wants to produce electricity?" But as I thought a little more, I realized that a dedicated line serves only one purpose. In other words, there must be nothing else on that electrical circuit besides the copier.

We use the word "dedicated" quite frequently in the life of the church. Have you dedicated your life to the Lord? My, he certainly is dedicated to ministry. She is a very dedicated parent. By this phrase we mean that the person in question has a clear priority that supersedes everything else in his or her life.

That's basically what I mean when I use the word "devoted," as I have in today's message. To be devoted to someone or something is to clearly make that person or concern your first priority. Everything you do takes a back seat to that priority. For example, a loving parent will immediately drop whatever they're doing when their child is hurt. The top priority always comes first.

In light of this, let's think about what it means to be "devoted to Christ." It doesn't mean that there is a slice of our life that is consistently reserved for Him, such as going to church regularly. Instead, it means that our entire life is centered around Jesus Christ, and there are no persons or concerns who come before Him in our lives. In fact, everything we do is conducted and evaluated in light of the question, "How will this behavior (attitude, thought, choice, belief, etc.) reflect on Christ?" If I am devoted to Christ, every aspect of my life must be considered in respect to the good of His Kingdom.

Let me suggest an illustration that might clarify what I'm saying. If my life were a bicycle wheel, Christ would not be one of the spokes in the wheel. He would be the hub around which everything else revolves. If a few spokes were missing or broken, the wheel might continue to function. But if the hub were missing, the wheel would be useless. When we are devoted, everything revolves around Christ, the hub. Colossians 1:17 says of Christ, "He is before all things, and in him all things hold together."

Jesus seems to have called us to this kind of devotion when He was asked which commandment was the greatest. "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul,

Care Fund Needs Your Support...



Our Care Fund, formerly called the Deacons' Fund, provides assistance to those who are financially distressed. The needs of the Christmas season, coupled with an urgent request that we received last week, have more than depleted our funds. In fact, we are currently nearly \$1,000 in arrears.

Let me explain how we got there. Last week, I received a call from a county agency telling me about a disabled woman who lives about 2 miles from the church. She had experienced some flooding and was currently without hot water or heat. The social worker reported that he had contacted all the agencies he was aware of, and was unable to find help. Would it be possible, he asked, for the church to do anything?

When I called the woman, she said she had applied for a grant to fix the furnace, and she had temporary heat. However, she had no means to fix the hot water tank. I called NK Supply to evaluate the problem, and they determined that a new tank was needed. I authorized the installation of the tank, knowing that there would be people in the church who would contribute toward this cost of \$1,073.

If you wish to contribute, please place your gift in the regular offering and mark it, "Care Fund." I am hopeful that we can build our fund beyond the current deficit, so we are in a position to help others when they call. I thank you in advance for considering a contribution to this project.

Sermon Series...

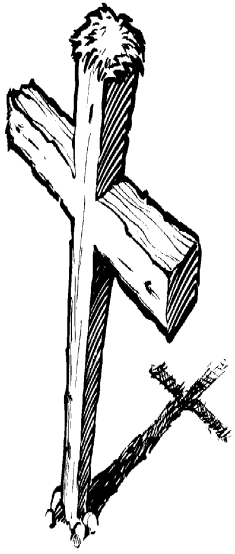
