WELCOME TO FAITH!

From Pastor Tom's Desk...

Are you tired of presidential politics yet? The election is ten months away, and I'm already starting to tune out the political ads and pundits. However, I keep reminding myself that this election cycle is critically important to the future of our nation. In fact, it is so important that we need to bring our faith to bear upon the entire situation. So I hope I don't offend you if I share a couple of political perspectives that I think are important.

First, the current campaign has reminded me that our hope is in Christ, not in any political figure, whether that figure is red, blue, or purple! Do I see any candidate who can fix the problems our nation faces? Probably not. The first priority of the Christian is to pray for the Lord to bring renewal and wisdom to our nation. Our basic need is for a change of direction. Fixing a few problems is not going to be adequate. We need to be praying for a change of attitude toward God and for a new submission to His will. Jesus Christ is still Lord of the Nations, including ours!

Second, having said that, it still seems to me that there are some candidates who are better than others. The responsibility of a Christian citizen is to evaluate the candidates in light of our Christian values. Are the policies and practices espoused by any given candidate consistent with Biblical teachings?

The first thing I look for in a candidate is a set of values that is consistent with my Christian convictions.

Third, this is not to say that simply being a Christian qualifies someone to be President of the United States. There are Christian men and women whom I respect deeply that I would not consider qualified to be President. In the process of selecting viable candidates, I start with those who espouse Christian values, and then I say, "Who among these is best qualified to be President?" After all, a President needs to understand national security, economic systems, social needs, and moral issues.

Finally, it seems to me that the President is in many ways the embodiment of who we are as a nation. He or she represents the character of the people who call themselves Americans. As I see it, that means we ought to elect someone who embodies the values that we embrace, and who lives those values in his/her daily lifestyle. Respect for people, civility and kindness, truthfulness, unwavering conviction, and integrity are elements that are essential to the presidency. Our voting can never be about whether we like a person's personality or appearance. Ultimately, the issues come down to character. I would suggest that Christians ought to be looking for candidates who demonstrate *Christian* character.

The trend in our society is to separate religious conviction from political persuasion – as though one's religious convictions have no place in political decisions. This could not be farther from the truth. My religious faith – this is, my Christian conviction – is the center of my identity. I can't lay it aside as I decide how to vote. I believe that religious faith is also at the center of our corporate identity as a nation. Our heritage is clearly Christian. As you evaluate candidates, remember to ask the question, "Who will help shape the character of our nation in the direction God wants us to go?"


