WELCOME TO FAITH!

From Pastor Tom's Desk...

Thomas Oden has written, "Sin dug a gulf in a relationship. The cross bridged it. Sin resulted in estrangement. The cross reconciled it. Sin made war. The cross made peace. Sin broke fellowship. The cross repaired and restored it."

The cross is the central point of history. The gospels show us that Jesus' entire earthly life revolved around the cross. It was the reason he came to earth. It was the highlight of divine love. It was, ironically, the victory of righteousness over sin.

Dr. Odgen's statement helps us understand the significance of the cross of Christ. Sin (our rebellion and self-gratification) separated us from God, who cannot fellowship with sin. This created a huge relational chasm between us and our Creator. The cross of Christ bridged that gap and made it possible to connect with God again.

Sin produced estrangement. In other words, it caused us to become alienated from God; we became strangers to God. The cross made reconciliation possible. It overcame our estrangement and restored our relationship with God.

Sin made war. Sin, by definition, is fighting against God. It is rebellion against God. This rebellion is usually expressed as self-centeredness or even self-gratification. But the rebellion that plagues us is really resistance to God's

will. We would rather run our own lives; do what we want rather than what God wants. Through the cross, we find peace with God. We give up our rebellion.

Sin robbed us of God's presence. Even though we were created for friendship with God, our sin undermined our relationship with Him. We found ourselves feeling lonely and wondering whether God really exists. The cross brought us back into relationship with God. We experienced a sense of relief and joy, just as two friends might discover when they apologize to each other.

The world has a hard time understanding the importance of the cross, because it doesn't fit with their value system. In 1 Corinthians, Paul said, "The message of the cross is foolishness to those who are perishing, but to us who are being saved it is the power of God" (1:18).

Our Christian faith and discipleship is centered in the cross. It was there that Christ paid the price for our sin, so that we could be forgiven and reconciled to God. Resist the temptation to allow your faith to become a set of religious rules and practices. Remember that Christian faith is always about relationship with Jesus Christ, who died for you so that you could become friends with God.

The cross is the supreme example of God's love and grace. It evokes gratitude

from us. It calls us to personal sacrifice. It instills divine love in us. We are people of the cross! May we never forget the magnitude of what Christ did there!

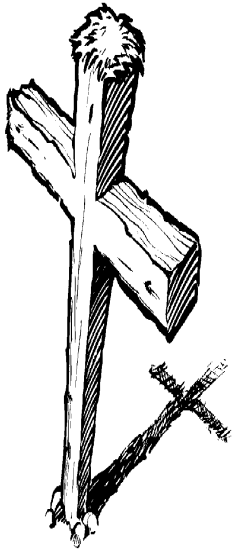
