## WELCOME TO FAITH!

### From Pastor Tom's Desk...

Lately I have become aware of the many ways in which we express trust in our daily living. I think we could probably put together a rather long list, such as...

- The trust I place in my doctor when I take the medicine he/she has prescribed
- The trust I place in my surgeon when I go under the knife
- The trust I place in my financial advisor when he/she says, "It's time to buy stock."
- The trust I place in my kids' teachers when I send them off to school
- The trust I place in the driver I am riding with
- The trust I place in the cook when I eat in a restaurant
- The trust I place in my banker when I deposit my pay check
- The trust I place in my friend when I share a confidence
- The trust I place in my bride when I say, "I do."
- The trust I place in my mechanic when I drop off my car for repairs
- The trust I place in my lawn service when I get their bill for my fertilizer treatments

- The trust I place in my ophthalmologist when he shoots my eye with nine laser beams
- The trust I place in my counselor when she says, "Here's what you need to do."

I could probably go on for some time. These are examples that randomly come to mind as I write. Here's what I would like you to notice: in each case, there is a factor that is beyond my control. When I undergo surgery, for example, I necessarily entrust my well-being to my surgeon. I don't have the option of staying awake to monitor how well he/she is doing!

This highlights the essence of trust. Trust, of course, is a central dimension of faith. When I profess to be "trusting in the Lord," I am saying that I am entrusting my well-being to His care. I am allowing Him to control issues and circumstances in my life that are beyond my own control. I may not know how He will accomplish that, but I live in the assurance that He will. Therefore, I live in the conviction that I will be OK, because the Lord is taking care of me. (This sounds a lot like the faith expressed by David in Psalm 23, doesn't it?)

When we say that we are "saved by faith," we are affirming that Jesus Christ will do for us that which is beyond our

control: that through His death and resurrection, He will forgive our sin and make us righteous in the eyes of God. Trust in Him, in this context, means trusting that He will give us eternal life even though we can never earn it.

The bottom line: faith is more than believing in Jesus. It is also trusting Him as your Savior and Lord.







## An Early Start to Spring Cleaning...

Although Lent starts early this year, before spring appears in many areas, it's an appropriate time for spring cleaning. Indeed, *Lent* comes from old German and English words for "spring." So, while it might be too soon to open windows or hang clothes on the line, now is the ideal time for some *spiritual* spring cleaning.

Lent calls us to examine our beliefs, confess and dispose of old grudges and selfish habits, dust off our Bibles for a new routine of study and prayer, air out our hearts and brighten up our attitudes. "Lent cleaning" lets the Holy Spirit freshen our faith – and it's never too early for that.
